The update you're looking for, which should be optional, is Windows 10 Update Version 1903. If you don't see it in the list, you'll need to use another method to upgrade your operating system. If you see an upgrade, you should be able to select it and complete it with the upgrade process. Just Windows Update prompts you to complete the installation. If you already have a product key, including a windows 8 or 8.1 product key, you should be able to upgrade for free to Windows 10.
